A FIELD GUIDE TO GOLF IN THE ASHEVILLE MOUNTAINS · 2026

The mountains kept *a secret*. Not anymore.

For the first time since 1942, the PGA TOUR is coming to Asheville. The inaugural Biltmore Championship tees off September 17–20, 2026, at The Cliffs at Walnut Cove — the first of four annual championships that will put these mountains on golf's professional calendar through 2029.

The world is about to discover what golfers here have always known. Western North Carolina holds more than forty courses: bent-grass fairways that stay comfortable through summer, elevation changes no flatland course can imitate, and a fall season that stretches deep into November against the most colorful backdrop in American golf. Donald Ross himself came from Pinehurst in the 1920s and left his signature across the city — a concentration of classic golf architecture few regions in the South can match.

All the golf. None of the obligation.

Here is what makes Reynolds Mountain different from a golf community: your home and your golf life are two separate decisions — and you get to make both freely. Buying in a golf community means committing to one course, one club, and one fee structure for as long as you own the home. Living at Reynolds Mountain means waking up minutes from the region's best playable golf and choosing whichever course suits the day. Join the club you fall in love with — or join nothing at all. The mountains don't ask for a commitment. Neither does your address.

The pages that follow map six courses chosen for one simple standard: golf a Reynolds Mountain resident can actually play — starting at your doorstep in North Asheville and working outward. A storied private club with an attainable membership, four outstanding public courses, and a historic resort layout open to everyone. It's all here, and none of it requires you to live behind its gates.

Country Club of Asheville — *the closest classic*

ABOUT 5 MINUTES · PRIVATE · DONALD ROSS, 1928



The Country Club of Asheville, established 1894 — just down the mountain in the Beaverdam Valley.

One of the oldest clubs in the South, with a Donald Ross course opened in 1928 and restored in 2016. Extensive practice facilities and PGA instruction on site — and as part of the McConnell Golf portfolio, membership here opens doors at more than a dozen sister clubs across the Carolinas, Virginia, and Tennessee. Close enough that a morning round still leaves the whole afternoon ahead of you.

The Omni Grove Park Inn — *a century of golf history*

ABOUT 10 MINUTES · OPEN TO THE PUBLIC · DONALD ROSS, REDESIGNED 1926

Golf has been played beneath the great stone facade since 1899, and Ross's 1926 redesign made it a classic — sweeping views of the resort, downtown Asheville, and the Blue Ridge beyond. Because it's open to the public, a round here is as easy for a weekend guest as for a member: one more reason visiting family never needs convincing.

Reems Creek Golf Club — *the Highlands, minutes north*

ABOUT 12 MINUTES • PUBLIC • HAWTREE & SONS OF OXFORD, 1989

Designed by the storied British firm Hawtree & Sons, Reems Creek carries a Scottish Highland character across rolling Weaverville terrain — elevated tees, valley views, and a Golf Digest four-star "Places to Play" rating. A twenty-station practice range, short-game area, and PGA instruction round it out. The local favorite for a spontaneous afternoon.

Asheville Municipal Golf Course — *the people's Ross*

ABOUT 15 MINUTES • PUBLIC • DONALD ROSS, 1927

A genuine piece of golf history: a Donald Ross design from 1927, part of a national historic district, and one of the oldest courses in Western North Carolina. Classic architecture at an everyday price — the kind of course you play on a Tuesday because you can.

Three Ross courses. One mountain address.

Country Club of Asheville, the Grove Park Inn, and Asheville Municipal — three Donald Ross designs, all within about fifteen minutes of Reynolds Mountain. Few addresses in the South put this much classic golf architecture within a short drive.

Two more, *an easy half hour away*

Broadmoor Golf Links — *the region's only links*

ABOUT 25 MINUTES · PUBLIC · KARL LITTEN, 1993 — REIMAGINED 2025

The only links-style course in the mountains — open fescue-lined fairways and firm, fast conditions that play like a different country from the tree-lined classics closer to home. Freshly redesigned and reopened in 2025, Broadmoor pairs the throwback layout with thoroughly modern amenities: a practice range, indoor golf simulators for year-round swings, and club fitting on site. When the weather turns or the itch strikes in January, this is the answer.

Black Mountain Golf Course — *home of the famous par six*

ABOUT 25 MINUTES · PUBLIC · EST. 1929

A beloved public course dating to 1929 at the foot of the Black Mountain range, in one of Western North Carolina's most charming small towns. Its claim to fame is the seventeenth: a 747-yard par six, once the longest hole in the world, and still the round your visiting foursome will talk about on the drive home. Pair it with lunch in town and you've built a full mountain day around eighteen holes.

The season lasts longer than you think

Asheville's elevation keeps summer rounds comfortable while much of the South swelters, and the region's long, mild fall — one of the most colorful in the country — stretches the season deep into November. When the Championship broadcasts those September fairways framed in Blue Ridge green, remember: that's a Tuesday afternoon here.

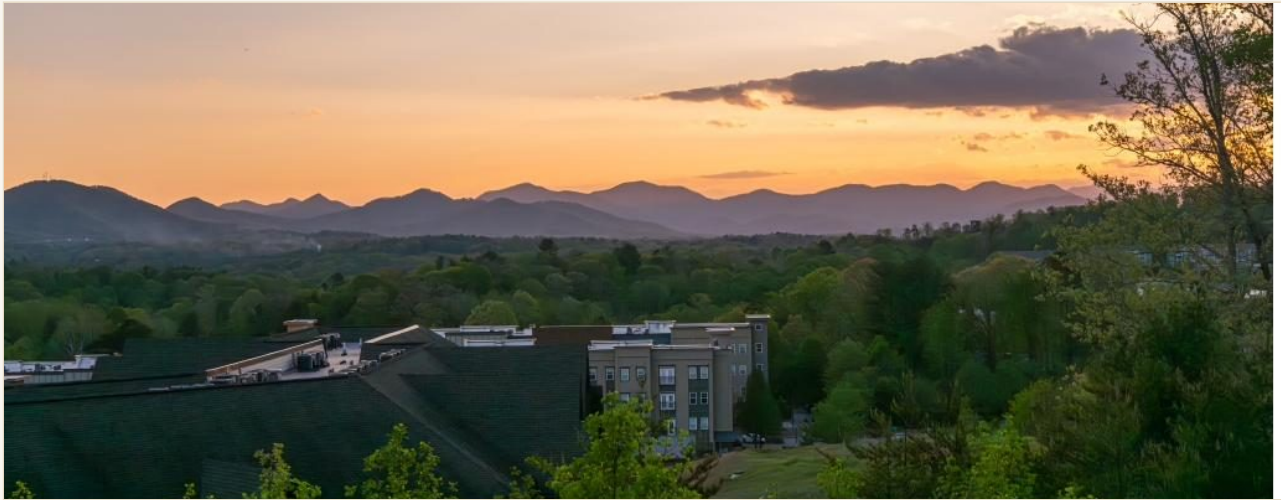
